Dear Valued Partner,

Re: Ontario Batteries and Electrical and Electronic Equipment Recycling

This past year, Ontario introduced the Batteries regulation (O. Reg. 30/20) and the Electrical and Electronic Equipment regulation (O. Reg. 522/20) under the *Resource Recovery and Circular Economy Act, 2016*, S.O. 2016, c. 12, Sched. 1.

As you are aware from our letter dated October 7, 2020, Best Buy Canada Ltd. (“Best Buy”) is working with Call2Recycle for the recycling of batteries, and with the Electronic Products Recycling Association (“EPRA”) for the recycling of information technology, telecommunications and audio visual equipment for which Best Buy is obligated as a producer under the regulations.

System limitations prevent us from collecting and remitting environmental handling fees (“EHFs”) for any producer responsibility organizations other than Call2Recycle and EPRA. We will collect and remit these EHF’s on your behalf if you are registered with these organizations.

If we do not receive your confirmation of registration with EPRA or Call2Recycle by **December 24th, 2020**, then we will not be able to collect and remit EHF’s on your behalf.

We also advise that we intend to cease collecting and remitting any EHF’s in Ontario in the near future. We will provide more information in future updates.
